



JB PARTITIONS CLEANING PRODUCTS AND MAINTENANCE INSTRUCTIONS

1 MELAMINE AND LAMINATE

The maintenance of melamine and laminate requires regular care to preserve their quality. Use a microfiber cloth with an all-purpose cleaner, glass cleaner or products based on ethanol, alcohol, or propanol. Clean flat surfaces with circular movements. For stubborn stains, a mixture of acetone and water can be effective, but do not let it sit for more than two minutes. A wonder gum can also help. Always test cleaning on an inconspicuous area first. Rinse with lukewarm water and dry with a soft cloth.

Avoid using paper towels on surfaces with deep textures and always wipe in the direction of the texture. Do not use dish soap, abrasive cleaners, hydrogen peroxide, floor cleaners containing oils, washing powder or other harsh chemicals. Strong acids, bases, pressure washers, paint strippers and solvents should also be avoided

2 SOLID WOOD

To clean solid wood and bamboo, use a soft cloth to remove dust. Prepare a solution of mild dish soap and warm water. Clean the surface with a damp cloth and remove stubborn stains with a mixture of white vinegar and water. Rinse with clean, warm water and dry thoroughly. Avoid using paper towels on surfaces with deep textures and always wipe in the direction of the texture. Always test cleaning on an inconspicuous area first.

Periodically maintain the wood with wood oil or wax. Avoid abrasive cleaners and scouring pads to prevent scratches.

3 GLAZING

Do not clean window frames and glazing with excessive water to avoid water infiltration and cloudy residue. Use regular cleaning products for glazing. Remove any streaks with alcohol-based glass cleaners. For greasier dirt, add a small amount of ammonia to the cleaning water. Avoid cleaning in direct sunlight to prevent streaks. Always test cleaning on an inconspicuous area first.

Clean the glazing from top to bottom to avoid drips. Use a squeegee to remove water, starting from the top and working down in straight lines. Dry the edges with a microfiber cloth for a glossy finish.

4 POWDER COATING

Powder-coated surfaces require careful cleaning to maintain their aesthetics and protection. Cleaning should only be done with a soft cloth. Use mild cleaning agents with a neutral pH value. Avoid solvents such as alcohol, ethanol and harsh chemicals. A magic sponge can remove light stains. Always test cleaning on an inconspicuous area first.

Do not use steel wool, sandpaper or other abrasive materials that could cause scratches.
